We wish everyone a lovely Easter holiday and we will see you all in the summer term on Monday 15th April at 8:40am!

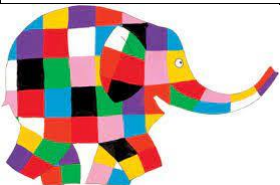


Volunteer Opportunity For Year 5 and 6

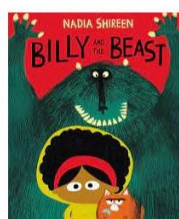

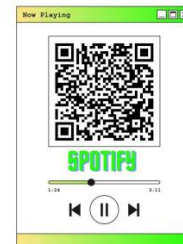

Appearing in the 1983 music video for "Sweet Dreams (Are Made of This)" with orange cropped hair and wearing a man's lounge suit, the BBC states, "all eyes were on Annie Lennox" as her Bowie-esque persona defied gender norms and spoke to a new generation of music listeners.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about CLICKBAIT

CLICKBAIT is a controversial online marketing strategy which uses sensationalist (and frequently misleading) headlines to encourage engagement with an article, image or video - often playing on users' emotions and curiosity, while most of the actual content is of questionable accuracy. Clickbait is also sometimes used to disguise scams, phishing sites and malware.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- HARMFUL MISINFORMATION**
Clickbait tends to grab attention by using sensationalist headlines, often using misleading information to entice users, who are frequently misled into clicking on links. Clickbait can be particularly harmful when it spreads false information, such as health warnings, or when it spreads misinformation about important events.
- INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT**
Clickbait headlines often use sensationalist language to attract attention, which can lead to inappropriate content being shared. This can include content that is offensive, harmful, or inappropriate for children.
- HIDDEN MALWARE**
Clickbait is often used to promote malicious software, such as spyware or ransomware. These programs can be used to steal sensitive information, such as passwords and credit card details, and can also be used to damage a computer or other devices.
- WASTING TIME**
Clickbait headlines often use sensationalist language to attract attention, which can lead to users spending more time on websites than they intended to. This can be particularly harmful for children, who may be distracted from their schoolwork or other important activities.
- ADVERTISING REVENUE**
Clickbait is often used to generate advertising revenue. This can be particularly harmful for children, who may be exposed to inappropriate advertising.
- SCAMS AND PHISHING**
Clickbait is often used to promote scams and phishing sites. These sites can be used to steal sensitive information, such as passwords and credit card details, and can also be used to damage a computer or other devices.
- DATA COLLECTION**
Clickbait is often used to collect user data, such as names, addresses, and phone numbers. This data can be used for a variety of purposes, including targeted advertising and identity theft.
- IMPACT ON BEHAVIOUR**
Clickbait can have a negative impact on children's behaviour, such as encouraging them to click on links without thinking about the consequences. This can lead to them being scammed or having their personal information stolen.

Advice for Parents & Educators

- START A CONVERSATION**
The sheer volume of clickbait can make parenting children against it quite challenging. It is vital to work to ensure parents remain vigilant for signs of concern they may see on online, so that they understand the risks of engaging with clickbait. Parents should be encouraged to talk to their children about the risks of clicking on links and to ensure they are not misled by clickbait headlines.
- PROMOTE CRITICAL THINKING**
Encouraging children to question the legitimacy of sensational headlines and the source of the information is a key strategy. Parents and educators should be able to help them to be aware of the risks of clicking on links and to ensure they are not misled by clickbait headlines.
- SPOT THE TELLTALE SIGNS**
There are certain common elements in clickbait, including headlines and images that use shock and outrage to grab people's attention - as well as exaggerated claims, such as 'Don't Miss This!' or 'You Won't Believe What Happened Next!'. Parents and educators should be able to help them to spot these signs and to ensure they are not misled by clickbait headlines.
- TAKE CONTROL**
Many parents get to blame for not having their children use social media each day, which obviously reduces the chance of exposure to clickbait. Alternatively, most internet-enabled devices have parental controls that allow parents to limit the amount of time their children spend on the internet. Parents and educators should be able to help them to take control of their children's online activity.

10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators ENCOURAGING OPEN CONVERSATIONS AT HOME

With tricky topics and occasional clashes of opinion, it can be challenging to maintain an environment where children feel able to talk candidly and honestly. However, encouraging such conversations helps to develop trust - making it easier to approach sensitive subjects as children get older. Here are our top tips for promoting open conversations at home.

- 1. CREATE A SAFE SPACE**
Children, learning to share their own ideas and opinions, need to feel safe. Being open and honest about their feelings and thoughts is a key part of this. Parents and educators should create a safe space where children feel able to talk candidly and honestly. This can be done by listening to their views, not interrupting them, and showing that you value their opinions.
- 2. CONSIDER OTHER OUTLETS**
Some children may find it difficult to talk to you. They may prefer to talk to a friend, a teacher, or a counsellor. Parents and educators should consider other outlets for children to express their views and feelings.
- 3. NORMALISE CHATS ABOUT FEELINGS**
Encouraging children to talk about their feelings and thoughts is a key part of this. Parents and educators should normalise chats about feelings and thoughts, and show that they value their children's views.
- 4. LISTEN ACTIVELY**
When children express their feelings and thoughts, it is important to listen actively. This means listening to what they are saying, without interrupting them, and showing that you understand their views.
- 5. ASK OPEN QUESTIONS**
Encourage children to share their thoughts by asking open questions. These are questions that cannot be answered with a simple 'yes' or 'no'. Examples include 'How do you feel about...?' and 'What do you think about...?'
- 6. RESPECT THEIR BOUNDARIES**
All children need to be able to set boundaries. Parents and educators should respect their children's boundaries, and show that they value their views.
- 7. LEAD BY EXAMPLE**
Model open, honest and healthy communication. Parents and educators should lead by example, and show that they value their own views and feelings.
- 8. HAVE REGULAR CHECK-INS**
Check in with children regularly to see how they are getting on. This can be done by asking them how they are feeling, and showing that you are interested in their views.
- 9. PROVIDE RESOURCES**
Provide resources to help children express their feelings and thoughts. This can include books, websites, and other resources that help children to talk about their feelings.
- 10. CELEBRATE EMOTIONAL EXPRESSION**
It is important to praise children for expressing their feelings and thoughts. This can be done by showing that you value their views, and by celebrating their openness.
